*The Woman Left Behind* by Linda Howard

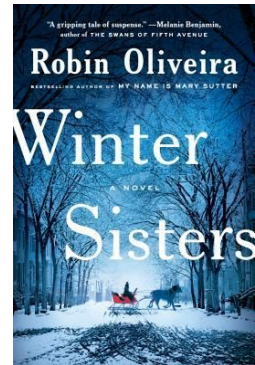
An intense and gripping thriller, with a dash of romance!

An empowering mystery set in late 1800s Albany, the sequel to *My Name is Mary Sutter*

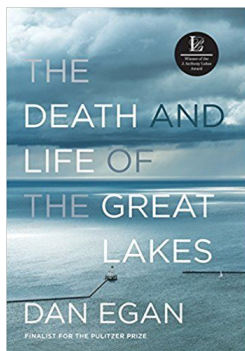
*The Recipe Box* by Viola Shipman
