The Overstory by Richard Powers

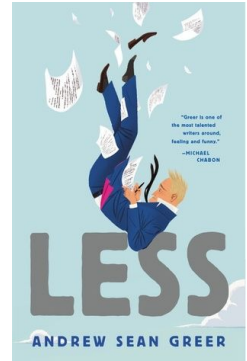
A sweeping and hopeful epic about trees and the humans who interact with them
