Lethal White by Robert Galbraith

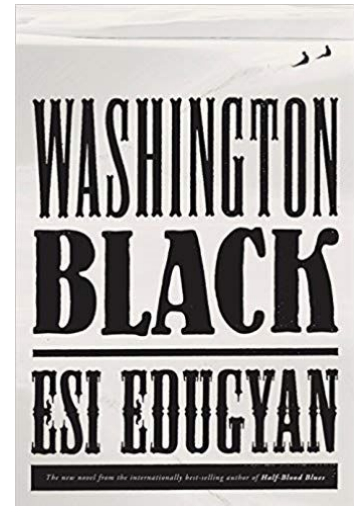
Galbraith's (J.K. Rowling's pseudonym) latest English crime mystery

Summer at the Garden Cafe by Felicity Hayes-McCoy

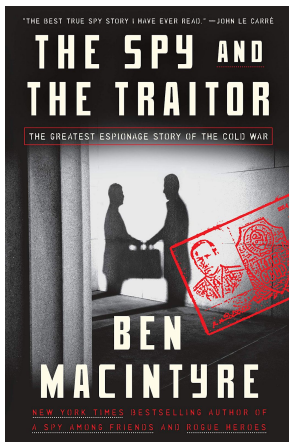
A heartwarming family novel set in Ireland, the sequel to *The Library at the Edge of the World*
