*The Kinship of Secrets* by Eugenia Kim

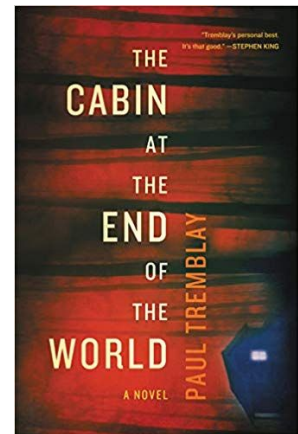
A coming-of-age story of two Korean sisters, separated by distance and by war

*The Cabin at the End of the World* by Paul Tremblay

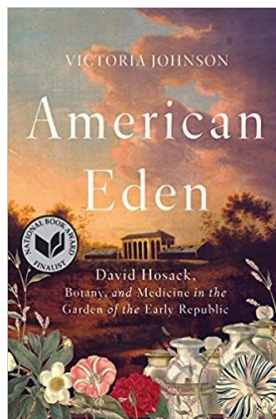
Home invasion thriller set at a cabin in NH, similar to Ruth Ware's *In a Dark, Dark Wood*
