Twin sisters, one black and one white passing, are the focus of this historical fiction novel set in the 20<sup>th</sup> century

A lyrical magical fantasy novel, featuring a labyrinthine house like no other

#### ***The City We Became* by N.K. Jemisin (L)**

#### ***The Only Good Indians* by Stephen Graham Jones (L)**

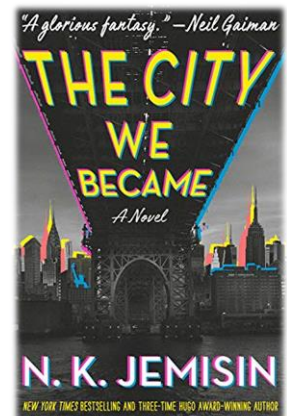
An acclaimed horror story centered on revenge and survival, set on a Blackfeet reservation haunted by the past (*Publisher's Weekly Best Book of the Year*)

#### ***Echo Mountain* by Lauren Wolk (L)**

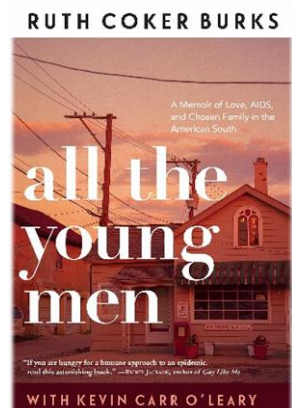
A moving, character-driven historical novel set in Depression era Maine – a healing children's book for adults!

#### ***Mill Town: Reckoning with What Remains* by Kerri Arsenault (L)**

Part memoir, part journalistic account of a working class mill town in rural Maine



#### ***All the Young Men* by Ruth Coker Burks (H)**

A moving memoir from a nurse at the frontlines of the AIDS epidemic in Hot Springs, Arkansas

#### ***Notes on a Silencing* by Lacy Crawford (L)**

A disturbing and powerfully personal memoir from a sexual assault survivor, describing her experiences at an elite NH boarding school

#### ***A Furious Sky: The 500 Year History of America's Hurricanes* by Eric Jay Dolin (L, H)**

A sweeping account of hurricanes throughout America's history

#### ***The Splendid and the Vile: A Saga of Churchill, Family, and Defiance During the Blitz* by Erik Larson (L)**

The acclaimed author of *The Devil in the White City* writes about Churchill's first year as Prime Minister
