***One Last Stop* by Casey McQuiston (6/1)**

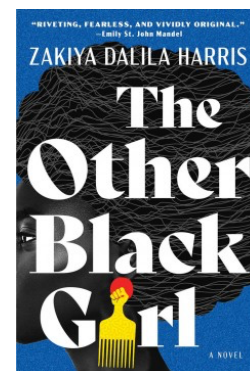
A young woman falls for a time traveler in this offbeat LGBT romance—from the author of *Red, White, and Royal Blue*

Historical fiction about Belle da Costa Greene, a Black curator who passes as white in order to fit into New York high society



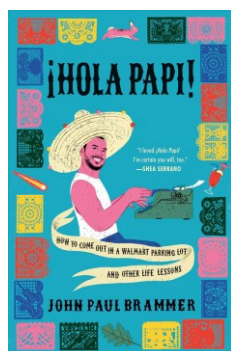
