***The Starless Sea* by Erin Morgenstern**

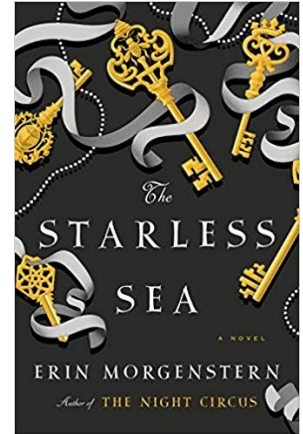
The author of *The Night Circus* returns with an unconventional fantasy novel

***Catch and Kill: Lies, Spies, and a Conspiracy to Protect Predators* by Ronan Farrow (362.88)**

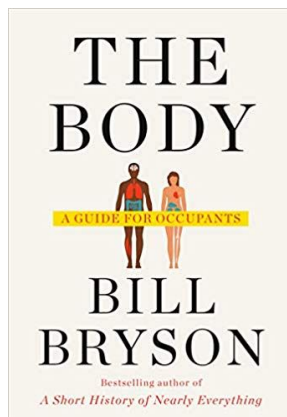
A behind-the-scenes look at the reporting that exposed Harvey Weinstein and led to the #MeToo movement
