***Apples Never Fall* by Liane Moriarty (9/14)**

Four siblings question their father's role in their mother's disappearance—from the author of *Big Little Lies*

***The Heart Principle* by Helen Hoang (8/24)**

Violinist Anna burns out trying to recreate the success of her viral video in this romance

***Sisters in Arms* by Kaia Alderson (8/3)**

This richly-detailed historical fiction depicts the courageous all-black Women's Army Auxiliary Corps battalion serving in World War Two

***Velvet Was the Night* by Silvia Moreno-Garcia (L, 8/17)**


Set in 1970s Mexico, this intricately-plotted noir follows a secretary and a gangster on the hunt for a mysterious missing woman

***Harlem Shuffle* by Colson Whitehead (9/14)**


This complex, gritty crime novel details a furniture salesman's criminal activities in 1960s Harlem—from the author of *Underground Railroad*



Nonfiction:

***Fuzz* by Mary Roach (9/14)**

From the author of *Stiff* comes a funny pop science book about animals encroaching on human lives and laws



***Travels with George* by Nathaniel Philbrick (8/31)**

Part history and part travelogue, this book traces George Washington's journey through the 13 original colonies upon his election to the presidency

***Blind Man's Bluff* by James Tate Hill (H, 8/3)**

When a genetic condition rendered Hill blind, he tried to hide it. Things changed for the better when he accepted his disability.

***Beautiful Country* by Qian Julie Wang (9/7)**

A lyrical memoir about growing up undocumented in Brooklyn and the resilience it takes

***The Quiet Zone* by Stephen Kurczyk (8/3)**

Journalistic exploration of Green Bank, West Virginia, named the quietest town in America for its location in the National Radio Quiet Zone

***The Dressmakers of Auschwitz* by Lucy Adlington (9/7)**

A solemn history of the women who made clothing for the Nazi officers at Auschwitz during World War Two
