Lost Roses by Martha Hall Kelly

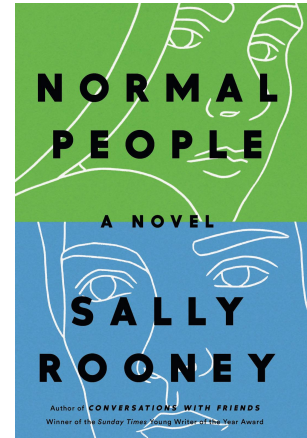
A prequel to the popular *Lilac Girls*, set in Russia and Paris during WWI

K: A History of Baseball in Ten Pitches by Tyler Kepner (796.357)

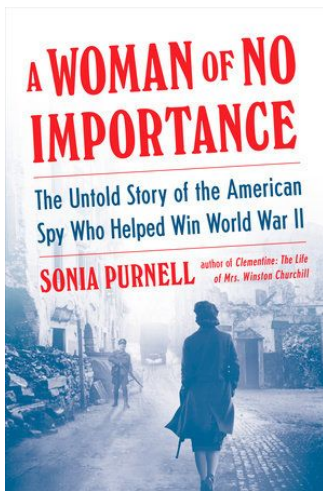
A book about ten game-changing pitches in baseball history
